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

CO² NEUTRAL BY 2030



Porsche, as a company, is aiming for carbon neutrality by the year 2030 and new battery technology is of course a huge part of that commitment. Porsche has partnered with BASF to develop new, high-performing lithium-ion batteries for electric vehicles and is expecting to begin operations at a Cellforce Group (based in Tubingen, Germany) battery production plant in 2024. Initial capacity is expected to be at least 100 MWh per year, powering 1000 motorsport and high-performance vehicles.

Markus Kamieth, member of the Board of Executive Directors of BASF SE stated, "We look forward to collaborating with Porsche and the Cellforce Group to develop future high-performance batteries for electric vehicles and work together towards our common goal of sustainable mobility," and he continued, "BASF's cathode active materials will be tailored to Porsche's specific needs leveraging our strong R&D capabilities. Furthermore, they will have an industry leading low CO2 impact thanks to our efficient manufacturing process, the high share of renewable energy, the upstream integration into the key raw materials as well as the short transportation route along the value chain...".

Markus Graf, Managing Director of the Cellforce Group noted as an additional benefit that as part of the manufacturing process, "...we have worked out a concept together with BASF on how production waste generated in the various areas can be collected and returned to closed-loop recycling. This saves costs and conserves resources as well as the environment."

A Good Problem to Have

Way back in September 2018 at the Banff Treffen we were lucky enough to win a set of Pirelli P0 Tires. Here is a photo with a couple Canadian Mounties.



My Porsche just had received a set of new tires so I put the Pirellis in storage. This made for a good opportunity to try to wear out the old ones as quick as possible...think autocross, track day, Treffen or a Porsche Parade. I never thought I would ever try to wear out tires, especially expensive ones, but the time had come.

None of these events were to pan out for our 2019 driving season as we only added 3200 miles to the odometer. 2020 really was a bust (thanks Covid 19) with only 1200 more miles added. In September 2020 I took my 911 to Porsche of Boise for Service. Mike Bell discovered a nail in the right front tire.

Was it bad enough to warrant changing out the front tire??...Nope, a quick trip to Big O Tires in Downtown Boise and I was as good as new...Free of Charge no less. On the way home is when I encountered the Big Stick that was covered in the last Tick. If you don't remember that story here is a photo of my close call. A missed opportunity to replace the back tires.



Nearing the end of 2020 in September I was starting to be concerned about the Pirelli tires dating-out since they are only good for about seven years or so. I did a quick calculation that told me the right rear tires would be down to the wear indicators in about 1,800 miles. They should probably last the summer anyway. April autocross didn't work out so no help there.

Then along came the May 1, 2021 President's Mystery Tour. Returning home and heading east on I-84 we were almost to the Ten Mile Road exit when I could see the traffic ahead was at a head stop.


I immediately pulled into the right lane so I could take the exit. The lane change was accompanied by a thump as I ran over something in the road. Before I could get to the stop sign the warning light came on alerting 29 PSI in the right rear tire (47 PSI is normal). Luckily we weren't in the middle of Nevada headed for Scottsdale Treffen. We pulled into Camping World only a mile away and the alert was now 8 PSI. Thanks to a service person we were aired up to 55 PSI and headed for home only two miles and two stop lights away. By the time I pulled into the garage the reading was 8 PSI again.

Surprisingly the tire looked about the same flat as it did full. After pulling the right rear wheel I discovered a one inch gash that put an end to the right rear tire. Finally the opportunity had arrived to put the new Pirelli rear tires on the car.

The front Pirellis are on the shelf waiting for the old ones to wear out. My hope is that they can expire because of tread wear and not a road hazard but time will tell.

FACES provides these services, as well as empowerment and self-defense classes, to specifically help victims of child abuse, elder abuse, domestic violence and sexual assault.

"WINTER-IZE" YOUR PORSCHE

With cooler weather and possibly snow and ice in the upcoming months, nothing is more important than your safety while out on the road so be sure to check the following off your list as you get your Porsche ready for the fall and winter.

Make sure your wiper blades are in good condition; replace if necessary. Check the pressure of all tires, and make sure all tires (including the spare) have plenty of healthy tread life and are free of any objects that may have pierced a tire and could cause a slow leak. Check your battery, brakes, all belts and hoses and make sure coolant/antifreeze and all fluids are at proper levels. Be sure your oil has been freshly changed and if you have a 4WD / AWD transmission, be sure that system is working properly.

It's also a good idea to have basic emergency / safety equipment in your vehicle, just in case. Examples include a first-aid kit, blankets, water, flashlights, an extra phone charger, jumper cables, a tire patch kit and a tire inflator and pressure gauge.

"Did You Know? The Batteries in Your Electric Automobile"

As electric vehicle production continues to grow, we are all learning more and more about batteries. These new and continually developing energy cells are replacing the fossil fuels that had for over 100 years been the sole source of power for nearly all vehicles on the road.

Unlike most of our portable electronics such as mobile phones and tablets, which use a single battery, the batteries that power cars are actually packs of batteries, comprised of thousands of individual lithium-ion cells. And while one of the advantages of Lithium is that it is the lightest of all metals, there is no actual lithium metal in these batteries, only lithium ions. Ions are atoms or molecules with an electric charge. Lithium-ion batteries have a higher energy density than lead-acid or nickel-cadmium batteries, allowing them to be smaller; hence their popularity.

What's a KWh? KWh can be explained as the unit of power or how much energy a device needs to work. To power a 100 W lightbulb for one hour requires 0.1 KWh. So how much electricity is needed to power a car? As a comparison, an average home requires about 3100 KWh per year; an electric car averages about 2000 KWh per year.

How long do they last? Most auto manufacturers have a five to eight year warranty on their batteries, but many experts currently agree that expected battery life should be between ten and twenty years before replacement is necessary. Replacement should occur when the battery can no longer power the vehicle safely and effectively, but the age of replacement is not the end of the battery's life. Automobile batteries can be repurposed and in many cases will actually be returned to the original factory in which they were manufactured for the purpose of storing electric power at that facility. Other former car batteries will be used to power homes, businesses and other infrastructure, after their automotive career has come to an end.

Hook and Reel


