- 2. New Member Introductions: No New Members in attendance.
- 3. New Business:
  - a. Adopt a Hwy: Lindsey said members will meet at the WinCo located at State Rd and and Hwy 55 on 9-25. Trash clean up will be in the Horseshoe Bend area.
  - b. Board Nominations: Lindsey stated that Blair Baertsch has formed a nomination committee as per our bylaws. The nomination committee is comprised of Blair, John Sommerwerck and Vicki Pentecost.
- 4. Old Business
  - a. Charity Update: Due to Covid concerns, we will have the same style of fund raising as we did last year.Online auction and raffle. No in person activities. There will be a two week push notification.
