- What is a DE?
- Learn to drive your car at fast pace in a controlled environment with experience on track and class room
- Any car or SUV is acceptable as long as it passes a technical inspection for safety.
- Done at a paved track with staffed corner stations with safety equipment.
- Classroom and on track coaching will show you the fastest way around the track for your car.
- Typically four 20 to 25 minute sessions on track, plus class room time.





Who runs these events

- PCA Volunteers
- DE Chair organizes the event
- DE Chief Driving Instructor (CDI)
 manages all the on-track activity.
- A lot of coaches to help you learn to drive better and thus, go faster





Who attends DE's?

- Drivers wanting to enjoy the performance of their car in a safe and controlled environment.
- Drivers wanting to be better drivers on the road in various driving conditions.
- Drivers want to get into various competitive high performance driving events like time trials and club racing.
- Drivers that want to learn more about the technology of their cars

Types of cars

- All makes and models are welcome
- Convertibles with factory roll over protection are acceptable
- Must pass a safety inspection to ensure all aspects of the car are safe at high speed.
- No changes, modifications, or upgrades required — your car is plenty capable as is to handle the track. In fact, we prefer you not start out on racing rubber.



What you will learn

Fastest way around a track:

- Best line track in, apex, track out
- Braking techniques straight line, threshold, trail braking.
- Weight transfer
- Car control
- Car rotation
- Meaning of corner station flags, hot pits procedures, etc.

FAQS: I'm worried about the other guy

- Strict enforcement of rules monitored by PCA staff, coaches, and corner workers — nothing goes unnoticed.
- Passing rules eliminate the uncertainty of "racing"
- Black flag station for control of non rule followers
- Two spin rule
- Bad attitude rule
- Run groups based on experience and skill.





FAQs: I don't want to wreck my car

- Nobody wants to wreck their car
- Very low % of incidents
- 100% of participants agree that they are better and safer drivers on the street.
- Track insurance is available. Not many beginners buy it, as it's rarely needed.











What happens at a DE?

- Drivers meeting each morning to go over corner station flags, passing rules, review of previous day.
- Run groups run through out the day based on published schedule
- Classroom sessions when not on track.
- Driving exercises like skid pad and braking exercises at some tracks.
- Lots of camaraderie and bench driving.
