

SILVER SAGE IS OFF TO A GOOD START IN 2023!



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This story really starts when Jay and Stacey Simmons started Simmons Fine Jewelry in 1989. Their son Blake, now Secretary of the Silver Sage Region, has worked at the store since the age of 19. Jump ahead to 2018,

when Blake, as store manager, became involved with the first Sun Valley Tour de Force, a Top Speed car event designed to benefit the community of Sun Valley and the local charity selected each year. As a founding sponsor, Simmons has returned year after year along with others including the Sun Valley Auto Club. The event brings together people of diverse backgrounds with a similar interest in cars. It sounds like the Porsche Club. Some of those people include Dave Stone, the owner of Sun Valley Auto Club, and some of the characters in the Silver Sage Region such as Sid Cannon and Liam Spencer.

Those connections led to Simmons Fine Jewelry joining the sponsors of the 2019 Oktoberfast, even though neither Jay nor Blake owned a Porsche. Blake knew several car collectors and noticed almost everyone had at least one Porsche. The standard explanation was "nothing drives like a Porsche." Blake focused on a 964, at least in part because his friend Dave Stone bought 964s for Singer, but also because he loved the body style. His interest seemed to coincide with a surge in the market for 964s, so he waited for Dave to find him one.

Meanwhile Jay Simmons was approaching a milestone 60th birthday and he was the type who was hard to surprise and even harder to buy for. His favorite color is orange, which gives you a hint of where this is leading. The jewelry business involves helping people celebrate their life events, so Blake was determined to make his dad's birthday special. All he had to do was find an orange Porsche and surprise his dad with it.

Obviously, his mother Stacey had to be involved and was thrilled with the idea.. He enlisted his friend Dave to act as interim owner, should they find an orange Porsche. Luckily, they found a 2019 Lava Orange Carrera T on ebay, with only 1400 miles, covered in a garage in California. There were several bids, but the auction ended without the bids reaching the reserve. The owner reopened the auction for one last bid and the Simmons family prevailed. Buying a car during COVID was not easy, but the owner was out of the country and his visa was about to expire, so both buyer and seller were pleased.





tabs on his large family, most of whom lived out of town, so Blake spent a great deal of effort secretly coordinating the arrival of all their family members. It seemed like a typical Cars and Coffee with a lot of nice cars and coincidentally planned on the day before Jay's 60th birthday.. Jay admired the beautiful Lava Orange 911 as it took the place in the lot, but didn't notice that his wife was driving it. Blake suggested that Jay should open the door and let his wife out of his car. By this

time the Simmons' family came out of their hiding places inside the jewelry store, each wearing a black T-shirt with the same orange 911 on the front. Blake removed his jacket to display the same shirt. Mission accomplished. Jay was totally surprised and thrilled. Even with the custom license plate "carats."

Now they had a Porsche in the Simmons family, but Blake wasn't having much luck finding his 964. You might recall the factory shutdowns and supply chain issues since 2020. That not only delayed production of new cars,

Now Blake enlisted his Silver Sage buddies, Sid Cannon and Liam Spencer to help conduct a mock Cars and Coffee in Simmons' parking lot to stage the presentation of the gift on the day before Jay's birthday. For years, Porsche has painted its cars in some rather unusual colors, whether they are "paint to sample" colors or limited colors that warrant a five paint can rating on rennbow.org. PCA did several articles recently on what the editors of Rennbow called these "unicorn" colors. We know that Silver Sage members own unusually-colored Porsches because we've seen some of them at our events, but others might not get out much. If you have a Porsche that sports a unicorn color, a paint-to-sample color, or a color that you think is rare, send a picture or two with a short description of the car to the Sage Tick editors and we'll see if we can put together an interesting article for a future Sage Tick or the Silver Sage website. We might be surprised at how many unicorns exist in Silver Sage.

but affected the supply and price of used cars. After more than a year Blake decided to widen his search beyond 964s and he and Jay joined PCA. Shortly thereafter, Blake and Dave discussed a 1980 911SC in a rather unusual color that Blake described as "brick red." (I've never seen a brick that looked so good.) Dave knew the seller and they were able to negotiate a deal.

A pile of maintenance

records and a Certificate of Authenticity came with the car. "Exterior paint color/code" is listed as "color to sample/9999." That doesn't provide much information, but many of us remember the Porsche legend about Porsche agreeing to paint your car to match your favorite lipstick if you provided a sample and the right amount of money. Although that story could not be true today, it may have been in 1980. A little internet research discloses that Porsche uses "9999" to indicate that the car was painted to sample in a metallic color.



The best unofficial source for all Porsche color questions is Rennbow.org. It's a great place for retired Porsche fans to spend hours looking at the hundreds of colors of Porsche paints. It was easy to look for colors in the red family that Porsche used in 1980. The editors of Rennbow show a color like Blake's 911 called "Indiana Red Metallic." They judged it four out of five on their rarity scale, with five paint cans reserved for the rarest of the rare, what they call the "unicorn colors." It was used on 924s from 1979 to 1981, but only on 911s in 1980. The Rennbow commentary states, "Porsche Indiana Red is actually an Audi color, so it makes perfect sense that it was used on the 924 which was assembled at Audi's Ingolstadt plant. While rare as a Porsche color, it was a common Audi 4000/5000 color. An undeniably attractive red, it also found its way onto a few 911s via Porsche's Paint-to-Sample program." Blake's 911 appears to be one of those few. There is only one 911 pictured in that color on Rennbow, so we know there are two Porsche 911s in that color, but the other one doesn't have a whale tail like Blake's. It seems like an "undeniably attractive" unicorn to me.



Wayne Roark, a long-time member and Past President of Silver Sage Porsche Club, passed away on December 15, 2022. Bowman Funeral Parlor was filled to capacity for his memorial service on December 30. Wayne and Shirlene's minister, Pastor Mark Traylor, who also presided at their wedding, reflected on some of our favorite memories of Wayne, which spurred some personal memories.

Wayne joined PCA in May of 1990, just a few months after Linda and I joined. One of his first Porsches was Velma Morrison's green 928 with Pasha interior. We agreed that when our turns came, we would drive slowly on our first runs and gradually work up to faster times. Our group started with a parade lap designed to allow drivers to casually observe and plan their drives. I started right behind Wayne and he inched along at first. It turned out he was just creating a big gap in front of him so he could take off. After a couple turns I couldn't even see him ahead of me. Wayne liked to drive fast. That started an active "career" of autocross racing in both PCA and SCCA.

For several years Silver Sage held a summer tour or gimmick rally up to our cabin at McCall. Wayne attended all of them and won two of the three gimmick rallies that I recall. Although none of the rallies involved fast driving,

Wayne still was competitive, although perhaps in a way that I had not anticipated. At the memorial service Pastor Traylor mentioned that Wayne had a catamaran. That reminded me of a serious discussion Wayne and I had during one of the tours to McCall. Wayne had accepted my offer to go for a ride on my catamaran. As soon as we got out to the middle of Pilgrim Cove the wind died and we waited for the wind or someone with a motorboat to rescue us. Fortunately, I had a cooler of beer strapped to the mast, because apparently no one noticed we were missing. During our discussion Wayne told me that after his first wife Earlyne passed away he vowed to enjoy the years he had left because life is too short. Wayne certainly made the most of his time.



Wayne announced his engagement to Shirlene during a Silver Sage tour to Union, Oregon. With Mike English "officiating" a mock wedding was held

in Union. Mike English and I used to joke about how we wanted to grow up to be Wayne. We envied Wayne's infectious smile, youthful appearance (I can't believe he was 20 years older than I) and his joyful spirit. I also admired his toys.



Specializing in the secondary market for luxury and exotic brands, there are always lots of special cars and automotive eye candy inside the Lupo Motors showroom. On this particular day, the parking lot was taken over by the club and offered a beautiful view of club members' Porsches. Inside were some incredibly rare and expensive cars, including a Jaguar XJ220 and a couple of vintage Ferraris. Perhaps most surprising to me was learning about the stringent preparation that goes into ensuring lasting results. Who knew that underlying rock chips could lead to premature failure of protective coatings or that previous applications of ceramic coat would keep adhesives from sticking? It was interesting to hear about the properties of PPF and the ability to hide blend lines and other paint imperfections with PPF as well. While the technology is constantly improving, it was reassuring to hear that Lupo Motors was less concerned with brand loyalty to any particular manufacturer and more concerned with using the absolute highest quality products available. The current leaders in the film industry according to Drake are 3M and XPEL, but they're constantly

evaluating new products and technology in the industry to ensure that their customers are getting the best possible products available. As Bob Kunz mentioned, it's probably best to leave the application of these products to the professionals as the tips and techniques learned come at a very high price if you're trying to do it yourself. Even the professionals make mistakes though, and it was surprising to hear about how Drake's team went through thousands of dollars of product on a single fender of a new GT40 just to get it perfect with no visible seams. All in all, it was a very enjoyable morning spent with friends old and new.



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
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
