# OKTOBERFAST KICKS-OFF IN STYLE

Silver Sage's 2023 Oktoberfast kicked off in style at its Friday night welcome dinner: A TASTE OF THINGS TO COME, which was held at the RAM's Stonehouse restaurant.

# OKTOBERFAST WALKING WINE TOUR

Linda and I were visiting wineries in Garden City one day when Linda commented that it was too bad we couldn't do a wine tour to the Garden City wineries for Oktoberfast. I had that in the back of my mind when it came time for us to plan the annual wine tour and suggested that we do a walking wine tour. We bounced the idea around the club and received positive feedback. Proletariat was a new winery scheduled to open in August and agreed to let us use their spacious building for lunch. As with most construction projects, however, Proletariat's building wasn't completed on time, but Telaya Winery stepped in to offer us the use of their upstairs room.

Over 40 people signed up for the tour, which exceeded Telaya's capacity, but we had a few cancellations. We met at Porsche Boise and everyone was allowed to find their own way to Coiled, our first winery. Leslie Preston, the winemaker, gave us a brief history of her winery and her philosophy regarding three wines that were set up in her new tasting room for us to taste, including one of her trademark sparkling wines.





Split Rail, our second winery, was just a couple blocks away. Split Rail prides themselves on their unconventional wines and each of their offerings were different in a good way. In keeping with their unconventional vibe, they had just acquired a poster that happened to contain a vintage Porsche. All of us admired the poster, although some didn't really notice the Porsche.

The group walked a couple blocks north for our final wine tasting and lunch at Talaya's great location on the Boise River Greenbelt. Telaya supplied samples of their wines and Whatever Works Catering provided the box lunches. Once again we were blessed with Oktoberfast weather that was perfect for a pleasant morning stroll to three fine wineries right in the heart of Boise.

A LOT MORE THAN JUST A CAR SHOW SID CANON

Do you remember going to the local Home & Garden Show?

Back in the day the demo person dropped celery and beets into a Veg-O-Matic bringing the passers-by to halt as he turned everyday vegetables into a strawberry milkshake. Maybe they still do that today.

Fast forward to the 2023 Oktoberfast Car Show and the modern version of the Veg-O-Matic. The DETAIL KID gets out his red and black Adam's Polishes 3" Polisher, fires it up on the hood of Blue Max and the crowd stopped in their tracks. The Detailing Kid, presented by Adam's Polishes was one of several attractions that made Oktoberfast the place to be on the last Sunday in September.

Just down the street was the first ever non-Porsche invited to attend Oktoberfast. An award winning, beautifully restored 1950 Volkswagen Beetle was the centerpiece between a group of 356s with a sign reading "The Grandfather of our Porsches".

In 1973 Porsche produced the first RS model for the American Market. Fifty years later at Monterey Week, Porsche revealed the 2023 GT3 RS 50th Anniversary car to the American market. Long time contributor to Oktoberfast's success, PCA and Silver Sage member Bob Shillington really stepped up his game this year.


Not only did he bring his own 1973 RS Porsche to the show, he drove to Indiana and trailered back a brand new, never

Completing the display was Bob's 2023 GT4 RS, Pete Eisenmen's 2007 GT3 RS and John Sommerwerck's 2019 GT3 RS.

In addition to providing a golf cart for George Follmer's convenience, Drake Beaudry brought a 1974 IROC replica car with period correct livery from the days when the near identicalappearing #4 car was driven by George in the IROC series. George and the car made for a great photo op. mature mainly because the cars are expensive. You never would have known it at Oktoberfast. Lots of kids, teenagers, young adults, middle agers plus the senior crowd to which I belong. I think it is because young folks view all Porsches, new and old, as being hip, cool and timeless. PCA and PCNA promote this image in their publications, podcasts and events. I like it because it keeps me thinking young too.

Another thing I noticed at Oktoberfast was how proud and eager every owner was to visit and explain their car's uniqueness.



Porsche cars have always been able to be ordered with a wide array of options and features making no two the same. Then consider aftermarket and customization possibilities that really make each car stand out.

Even with five white 991's (including my wife's Turbo) I bet the differences between each were considerable. The variations were really evident on "Early 911 Row" where several examples got the full race/custom treatment top to bottom.

While it's easy to find smiling faces at Oktoberfast one face really stood out. Chris Nolan has been loving his 965 Turbo for over 23 years. (I like to call it a 964 because that really gets him fuzzed up) Chris has some physical challenges that don't seem to dampen his spirit when the Oktoberfast Car Show rolls around. I only see him once a year but just being around him for a few minutes is always a pick-me-up and gives me an attitude adjustment just when I need it the most. Chris, congratulations on your award.

Finally, a comment on the Village at Meridian. WHAT A VENUE FOR A CAR SHOW!! At 7:30 AM the Village Security and Maintenance Crew were already at work clearing, cleaning and preparing the streets for Oktoberfast. Tables, chairs, tents, stage all in place ready to go. And then there's the Village itself. We were lucky freezing weather had not arrived because the fall foliage and flowers put on a display that rivaled the cars. # • OKTOBERFAST MAIN EVENT

Oktoberfast has evolved to be a weekend event and it is the kick-off for the Silver Sage Region's charity drive. This year's charity is the City of Good. The weekend event is sponsored by the SSPCA and Porsche Boise.

The main event for Oktoberfast is the Porsche Car Show that has historically been held on the first Sunday of October and is additionally sponsored by The Village at Meridian. This year it was held on Sunday, September 24th to eliminate conflict with Rennsport 7 which was being held in Monterrey during the first week of October. Despite the change in timing, we had another record for attendance with over 150 entries for the show.



The Silver Sage team has been doing this show for several years and this is the ninth year at The Village at Meridian. It is the perfect venue for a car show and the Village provides excellent support for us with tables. tents, chairs, signage, street closures. posters and gift cards and prizes for raffles and poker walks. Hugh Crawford, Director of Property Management for CenterCal, even selects a Host Trophy for his favorite car.

This year Ernie Monroe has captured last year's winner, a beautiful Python Green GT4 in graphic design used for T-Shirts, posters, trophies and merchandise. He continues to do incredible work for Silver Sage and our Oktoberfast and we really appreciate everything he does.

The registration process worked flawlessly with Bob Pentecost carrying the heavy load of getting details out to participants; organizing registration information; packets prepared;



and distributing participant lists for dinners, drives, t-shirts, beer mugs and pins to other volunteers.

From 10:30 AM until 11:30 AM, cars that can get past a crack security crew of Vicki Pentecost and Liam Spencer (muscle) enter the show with a first stop at the Registration tent where Becky Grover, Nancy Sommerwerck and Lindsey Robinson check people in and send them on to the next station. The next station is the Photo station, and it might be a bit like being booked at the jail (I imagine) where you hold up your packet for a picture by Greg Myers and then a mug shot of you and your car.

After mug shots, cars move on to the Merchandise station. Volunteers Molly Cuddeford, Vicki Cannon and Tabitha Post make sure everyone gets the items they ordered.



T-Shirts, beer mugs and club pins are handed out and then cars are directed to staging and parking.

Sid Cannon had cars laid out in most of the available Village parking areas and his volunteer parking crew did an excellent job of getting everyone parked in the right areas in time for the car show to begin at noon. Not an easy task and as you can imagine... parking is the most important function for the day. They even contend with an unfortunate delay while the Village had to tow a car left overnight that interfered with the display of some of the older 911 cars.



All registered cars have pretty much been parked on schedule and the show starts at noon as advertised. It is now time to enjoy the 150+ beautiful Porsches and the Village at Meridian. The weather is clear and cool... perfect for a car show!



Randy Bloom has coordinated the trophy awards and judging again this year and he exceeded expectations.



# A PORSCHE DRIVE EXPERIENCE

If you received an email that said "You've won .... Just fill out the attached form and return it to us to claim your prize." Very carefully, you open the form and find it is asking questions such as Tax ID number and other personal information. What would you do? Probably the same as Vicki when she received one last September, consider it spam and delete it.

Later in the day Vicki mentioned to me about the email she received and I offered to take a look at it since it didn't seem to be from a Nigerian Prince. The offer was for a free three-day Porsche rental; it didn't seem to be a typical scam so I reached out to Tina at Porsche Boise, sending her a copy. A few hours later Tina got back to me and said she had located the sender at Porsche and the offer was real! We figured at Porsche Parade in Palm Springs last June, Vicki must have signed up for a drawing and promptly forgot about it. If you're not familiar with the Porsche Drive program, it allows you to drive a Porsche for a day, a weekend, a week, or more. You rent from a fleet of vehicles and choose the perfect one for the road ahead – with no long-term commitments. It is available at a limited number of Porsche Centers. The closest location to Boise is Sacramento so we started formulating a plan around that location.

The offer had to be used by the end of 2023 so we decided we would pick up the car in Sacramento (Rocklin, actually) and explore the foothills of the Sierra Nevada mountains. We originally reserved a 2023 Carrera S, but at the last minute it was not available, so we settled for a base model Carrera with a PDK. I was okay with the PDK because I had never had any drive time with a PDK, and a base model car was fine since it would be a major change from my 1997 Carrera.

We picked up the car on Thursday morning and after a quick briefing on the features of the car we headed east on I-80. Fifteen miles later we exited the freeway and after that we didn't see another freeway until shortly before we turned the car in. We headed south on Hwy 49 which is described as "a region of quaint bed and breakfasts, shops lining historic main streets, award winning wineries, fine restaurants, antique and gift shops, art galleries, golf courses, unlimited recreation and the chance to travel back in time." A curvy drive of 25 miles took us to Placerville where we stopped for lunch and happened upon a great little restaurant called Heyday Café. Then we headed to our hotel in Angels Camp, another 75 miles down Hwy 49.

On Friday we made a circular route to visit Columbia State Historic Park, a preserved gold rush era town, and then on to Murphys where we found many restaurants and winery tasting rooms. Looking for a lunch restaurant we found many were very busy, but decided to take a chance at Toscano's Restaurante since they had a sunny patio.

Soon the patio filled with locals who were able to tell us which winery tasting rooms were best. It was a relaxing afternoon and soon we headed back to Angels Camp. We drove only ~40 miles that day, but the roads and towns were quite nice.


Saturday's drive was on a more direct route back to Porsche Rocklin as we had an afternoon flight home. The first part of the drive was on Hwy 49 and was great, but when we hit the outskirts of Sacramento we had to deal with traffic we hadn't seen in the foothills.


Hwy 49 was the perfect road to get acquainted with driving the Carrera; fortunately we visited in the off season as people at Porsche Rocklin said in the summer months there are a lot of tourists on the road. The only thing I want to say about driving the car is "it was great!" Using Sport mode is fun as the car does rev-matching downshifts coming into curves and the exhaust sound features a bit of popping. If you want to know how the Carrera drives, you can find many magazine articles with

> more extensive reviews than I can provide. Since the rental cars I usually drive are a Chevy, Hyundai or similar, it was nice to have a rental car that drove properly and I didn't have to worry about it wandering down the road.

Finally, if you are considering the purchase of a new Porsche, the Porsche Drive program is a perfect way to get some seat time in a prospective car. Two door, four door and electric models are available at many Porsche Centers around the country. Also, picking up and returning the car you'll find the people you encounter at the Porsche Center will be much more pleasant than you'll find at the airport.

# RENNSPORT REUNION SHOULD BE ON EVERYONE'S BUCKET LIST

Attending Rennsport Reunion 7 in beautiful Monterey's Weathertech Laguna Seca Raceway was an extraordinary experience and I would recommend every Porsche owner make plans to attend the next event when it happens in the next 3-5 years. Meticulous preparation and an outstanding collection of cars, personalities and exhibits resulted in sensory overload that had virtually everyone smiling. A record breaking year with the largest attendance for a Porsche only event with 91,500 people attending is a testament to the sold out attraction.

Spread over 4 days in early Fall along the Central California Coast assured mostly good weather although we had the misfortune of attending on Saturday which featured a heavy mist throughout the day compared with the lucky ones that had bright sunshine for the balance of the weekend. The main drawback was many cars did not take to the track either due to lack of rain tires or preserving the cars from being damaged. The Porsche collection that braved the elements were typically piloted by top notch drivers.

My personal highlight were all the prototypes at Rennsport with no less than thirteen 917's in attendance. My experience in IMSA goes back to the 956 and 962 dominating days during the 1980's. It was great to see about 15 of them along with the cars that campaigned in Europe. The storied 917 was developed for LeMans endurance racing and ended up dominating the Can Am series and was banned from competition by 1973, solidifying its moniker as the greatest race car in history. The beautiful lines of the 956 and updated successor the 962 were well represented and a highlight was the pit lane lineup on late Saturday afternoon showcasing these great cars. If only a race would have commenced...

Late 70's and early 80's endurance racing 930 & 935 also graced the event with their outrageous whale tales and fun graphics. The Dick Barbour car was brilliant as were the turbocharged Interscope Swap Shop and Bruce Canepa wheeled 935 from his shop in Scotts Valley. They put on a whale of a show in the drizzle battling nose to tail for 12 laps.

The level of detail and work involved in bringing all the exhibits to Rennsport and commissioning artists to add a lively touch to the proceedings was another highlight.



Historic cars and memorabilia were found everywhere and a single day did not allow you to take in all of the interesting facets of this event. The Tag Heuer display contained pertinent watches and associated historic cars and figures. Steve McQueen and his 917 featured in the movie "LeMans" along with his driver's suit was a highlight along with the first Porsche to compete at LeMans-a 356 with aerodynamic wheel skirts was Porsche's first win at the 24 hour classic. Other significant cars included those that competed in La Carrera Panamericana road race in Mexico, early 904 and 908 prototypes that showed their prowess with power and light weight and even a rare Indycar campaigned by Teo Fabi in Fosters Beer livery. An early IROC Porsche assigned to Denny Hulme was also there-that was a fantastic series gathering all the best drivers of the day to see who ruled on both ovals and road courses.



Road going Porsches were also featured at various locations around the circuit and could be whimsical or rugged showcasing the cars and their capabilities.





You could even catch a ride in a Cayenne from the top of the corkscrew down the hill on a bumpy dirt course. Special parking for the event featured each model gathered together and some people were lucky enough to score hot laps around the track too.

And if all this wasn't enough, there were two Carrera Cup races on Sunday and Porsche tractor races. There were also opportunities to meet current and former race car drivers, including Silver Sage member George Follmer. For non-Porsche entertainment, a Doobie Brothers concert took place on Saturday. In short you have to see and attend Rennsport to comprehend how important this is to Porsche and their unique customers. I was able to meet with several Porsche employees from Germany and Atlanta and was struck by how passionate, welcoming and knowledgeable they are.
