

AUTO INSURANCE

"Your Porsche has good brakes, do you have good insurance?"

The club's first Tech Talk for the 2024/2025 season looked at auto insurance policies and legal issues around claims and was held at the Toybox Car Club on November 16, 2024. The event began with a presentation by Riley P. Evans, Producer and Agent for Chrysalis Insurance Agency, Boise, ID. Riley covered the basics of auto insurance, valuation and umbrella policies.

Liability - coverage for an at-fault accident – basic coverage is \$250,000/\$500,000. Is this enough for you?

Uninsured Motorist/Underinsured Motorist (**UM/UIM**) – Idaho policies carry a minimum \$25,000. UIM protects YOU; consider matching your liability coverage amounts.

Actual Cash Value (ACV) - Cost of the vehicle new MINUS depreciation. Depreciation is always factored into this value.

Stated Value (SV) – Policy holder states a value for their vehicle that they want to pay for their policy. Insurance company pays the lesser of SV or ACV.



Agreed Value or Guaranteed Value -

Polices written for high value or collector cars from agencies such as Hagerty, Leland West and Grundy (among others). This specified value will be paid in event of a covered total loss. If appraisal is necessary, consider using Lupo Motors (Local) or the Hagerty Valuation Site. Bring a Trailer and other online auctions can also be used to support a valuation.

Umbrella Policy –

written in increments of \$1 million, normally based on your net worth. Protects your assets in the event of a bodily injury claim against you. In order for an umbrella claim

to be accepted, the loss must be a covered loss (permitted usage of the vehicle). Extends coverage over any underlying property listed on the policy (home, auto, boat, OHV, etc.). This can be used to extend coverage to bodily injury and personal injury liability claims when underlying policy would extend that coverage.

Exclusions - these are specific usages that a standard policy does NOT cover. Examples are

HPDE (on a track) or autocross events. Rallys and tours on public roads are covered usage.

LIVERY EXCLUSION:

will not pay a claim involving transport of people and/or goods for hire.

Track Insurance - General agreement by Riley, Insurance Broker, and those members attending, YOUR INSURANCE POLICY IS A CONTRACT, READ AND REVIEW, THEN DISCUSS WITH YOUR AGENT!

that the decision to purchase HPDE Track Insurance should be based on your personal risk tolerance. A single weekend policy costs less than \$2000 and a single season policy is available for approximately \$10000, normally with a 10% deductible.

Collector Car Insurance - Different insurance companies have different use restrictions. Some will

limit to driving to and from car shows, others will allow any usage (within

standard policy allowances) as long as the owner has a second daily driver car. Based on miles driven/year. Very low rates because of low usage. Considered very low risk for insurance company.



After a robust question and answer session, the event continued with a presentation by Matthew Taylor, Managing Partner and Senior Attorney at Taylor Law Offices, Boise, ID. Mr. Taylor discussed the following:

Diminished Value - Loss of market value of vehicle when vehicle is damaged and repaired.

INHERENT DIMINISHED VALUE: based on previous accident and Car Fax

REPAIRED DIMINISHED VALUE: vehicle repaired but not to OEM/ "factory" condition

TIPS IF

INVOLVED IN

AN ACCIDENT

Documentation of Diminished Value -

Only applicable for a "No fault" accident. Obtain documented change in value of vehicle, then present to insurance adjuster for that amount. Note that diminished value claims may need some legal help in order to protect your

Porsche investment vehicle when vehicle is damaged and repaired.

1. Acquire as much documentation as possible.

2. Get a police report

3. Take lots of

pictures - showing total extent of damage on all vehicles

4. Repair estimates – OEM (Original Equipment Manufacturer) vs OES (Original Equipment Standard – not necessarily Porsche factory parts, maybe even used parts!

5. Porsche appraiser – may be necessary for a diminished value claim. Regularly take photos of your Porsche!

6. Body Shop Hourly Rate Comparison – check out the app "Labor Rate Hero."

Don't speculate with your statements about what happened at the scene. Do NOT volunteer information.






